- 4) Rule 21 Para 3. Phoned Results, Winning team to phone through the results.

The change above was rejected so the Home team remains responsible for phoning through the result.

- Recorder said that over the last few weeks he has been asked “who is the home team” this relates to the finals series, after discussion it was decided to enter the following information to the Playing Rules: -

RECORDERS REPORT Continued

Rule 11 para 4 Designated Home Team for Finals: -

1st and 2nd Semi Finals, Whoever finished above the opponent on the DRDA ladder, is the home team.

Preliminary and Grand Finals, Toss A Coin, the winner of the toss has the right to throw first in game one but must put his/her team up first.

If the winner of the toss decides to make the opposition throw first then the opposition must put his/her team up first.

In either case the team which goes up first is the designated home team.

- Recorder said that due to reports coming in of games finishing early he suggests changing the B Grade Doubles and the C Grade Singles to best of three games.

This was discussed and accepted for the start of the Summer Comp with the proviso that it can be changed back if it proves not to be working out as expected.
